PARENTS

We love the sound of kids in our service! Here are some ideas to keep them engaged. Relax! It's ok to let kids be kids!

Sit close: Consider sitting up front where it's easier for kids to see and hear.

Explain: Kids are curious! Explain what's happening in the service.

- **Participate:** Sing hymns loudly, pray, respond, etc. Children learn by following your lead.
- Activities: If you would like a bag of quiet activities for your little ones, ask an usher and they will provide one for you.

Wander: It's ok to move around. Sometimes it's easier to let fidgety kids move a bit.

Need to Leave? No problem, but please come back! Sometimes kids just need a break. There are speakers in the narthex & lounge so you can hear. The narthex is a great place to get the wiggles out, and the lounge is nice if you need privacy.

Ask: Questions or just need help? Just ask one of our ushers.

Childcare: The nursery is down the hall in the Multipurpose Space for infants to age 4 and is available during both worship services. If you need assistance, an usher can help you. C&C Kids is offered to kids pre-K through 3rd grade. Kids depart the sanctuary during the Passing of the Peace and return to worship before communion.

Because justice issues related to homelessness, hunger, poverty, racism, education disparity, and more are complex situations that require complex conversations and answers, SPARK and The Dwelling team up (Spark'Dwell) to offer opportunities for young people and adults to spend a week during the summer or fall/spring break participating in Spirit and Service-Learning Experiences. Hosted (housed) at a local partner church, participants engage in a week of relationship-building, education, storytelling, and service alongside formerly or currently homeless individuals. In doing so, participants will be able to understand the complexity of the systems and institutions perpetuating injustice and inequity, how the church is responding as MaPhew 25 people, and ways that they can continue to advocate for justice in their own communities.

Why go on a Spark'Dwell trip? What's so great about it?

It is Spark'Dwell's belief that service without education is empty. This experience offers a faith milestone that expands what we know to believe what God's kingdom looks like. This week is filled with relationship building, learning experiences, education, and service alongside formerly or currently homeless individuals.
